# Welcome back!

Welcome back to children, parents and staff at the start of a new academic year. I hope that you had an enjoyable and restful break and are ready for the year ahead. A particular welcome to the children of our new Reception class who have been in school for mornings or afternoons this week and welcome to Miss Gold and Miss Walk who have joined the school as the teachers of Year 5 and Year 6 respectively.

#### Term Dates 2018-2019

Today, you should have received a paper copy of the term dates for this academic year. The term dates for St. Teresa's School are not the same as Birmingham Local Authority's maintained schools' dates. The changes occur prior to Easter, as the school will be open for Holy Week, with a shorter Easter holiday than Birmingham maintained schools and there will be a longer half term at Whitsun.

#### Grammar School Entrance Exams

#### Extra-Curricular activities

Also next week, the after school activities commence; Cookery for Year 3 children on Monday, Football for Year 1 and Year 2 on Monday, a selected football group on Tuesday, Sewing for Year 6 on Tuesday, Zumba and Fitness for the Juniors on Wednesday, Percussion for Year 2 and Year 3 on Thursday and Football for the Juniors on Thursday. Involvement in these activities is only for those who have returned the consent forms. If you have not received a specific letter with the information about a club or clubs please contact the school, but please noted that several of the groups are already full.

## Roald Dahl Day

Next Thursday, 13th September, is Roald Dahl Day. This date marks what would have been Roald Dahl's 102<sup>nd</sup> birthday. As part of this day all of the children in Years 1 to 6 may dress as a character from a Roald Dahl book. There is no charge for this event and we ask that parents and carers do not go to any expense to provide an outfit or costume. Children may have the opportunity to watch an extract from or even a complete film based on Roald Dahl's books. As several of the films are PG rather than U certification you may not wish your child to watch them. Should there be any or all of the PG classified films that you would rather your child did not watch please let the school know in writing.

#### Parish Mission

#### Infant Free School Meals

Children in Infant classes are provided with a meal at dinner times under the Infant Free School Meal Scheme. Children in Junior classes are to pay £2.30 for a school meal unless entitled to free school meals.

The parents or carers of any children who would be entitled to free school meals regardless of the provision for the Infant children are encouraged to register this entitlement through the school office as the school will receive £1,320 per child through Pupil Premium funding.

It is lovely to see how smart the children look at the start of the new school year. Please do ensure that the different elements of your child's uniform, including coats and P.E. kits, have their name on it.

#### School Fund
