Breakfast Club

A reminder to parents and carers who use the school's Breakfast Club provision that it is not intended to be a very cheap source of child care prior to the start of the school day. The priority is to offer children a healthy breakfast and it is helpful to parents/carers that the children are being supervised in school. If children persist to come to Breakfast Club but not intending to eat or directed by parents/carers not to have the food provided, the offer will be withdrawn for those parents and children. Children may of course have something at home prior to coming in but the priority is the assurance that those that attend have a selection of breakfast options to start their day, if it helps parents and carers to manage their commitments that is a bonus.

Black History Month



Last year, a parent suggested that children could wear clothes with their national colours in recognition of Black History Month. This was done and we will be repeated this year. Therefore, on the Wednesday 24th October; United Nations Day, children may come to school wearing their own clothes, ideally including colours reflecting their family's origins, for example for me that would be green, white and gold; for our Polish children, white and red, for our children with Jamaican origins it would be green, black and yellow. Children whose families come from two or more countries can choose a selection of their colours. Children are also welcome to come in their national dress if they wish.
