## Parents' and Carers' Briefings

## MacMillan Coffee Morning

Next Friday, there will be a Coffee morning for MacMillan Cancer Support at school. All parents, carers and parishioners are welcome. We are asking you to send in cakes and biscuits for the Coffee Morning. The school will provide the teas and coffees. Please bring in any cakes/biscuits from Monday 25th September onwards.

Children may wear their own clothes on Friday; ideally to include something green which is the colour associated with the MacMillan cancer charity. However, as Year 2 and Year 4 will be out of school for visits to places of worship on Friday the children in those classes may wear their own clothes on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> September.

We are asking that a donation of £1 is made for each child. The children may then wear their own clothes, have a cake, or cakes if enough are donated, and a drink. If you are unable to attend you are welcome to make a donation at the school office in support of this worthwhile cause.

## School Uniform

Last academic year, when they were in Year 5, the children now in Year 6 were the leading class for attendance. The overall attendance for the whole school in 2016-2017 was 96.2%. This was an increase on the attendance of the previous academic year, which was 95.65%. We need to improve our attendance again this year!
