Christmas dinners

Christmas Dinner at school will be on Tuesday 19th December. If your child is in the Juniors and does not usually have a school dinner but would like a Christmas dinner it will cost £2.25 the same as any school meal, payable on Monday 18th December. Infant children will be provided with a Christmas dinner without any charge, as is usual for school dinners for these classes. Junior children who have a school dinner are to pay the usual payment and will then automatically have a Christmas meal on that day.

A grandparent of each of the Reception class children is invited to dine with their grandchild that afternoon. A letter with all of the details was in the Reception class children's bags last Friday. Please contact the school if you require another copy.

Christmas Parties

Next week, the children will have their Christmas parties. The Infant children may come into school wearing their party clothes on Wednesday 20th December. The Junior children may bring their own clothes to school to change

into after dinner on Thursday afternoon, 21st December. The school will provide refreshments for the parties.

On Friday 22nd December, the children in Years 1 to 6 may bring in, at their own risk, toys for a 'Toy Day'. These toys are to be games or activities that can be played with one or more other children, not electronic devices which are often single player activities.
