Safeguarding

During Monday morning's assembly, we shared the importance of making sure that external doors are closed when they should be. We also discussed that children should not be giving sweets or chocolates to classmates, which does happen when it's a child's birthday, without the staff knowing who is having the sweets or chocolates. We discussed the examples of a 'Snickers' or 'Bounty,' which could not be eaten safely by children or staff with a nut allergy. We also discussed that if a child who is involved in an after school activity gets hurt the child should make a member of staff aware and if required have medical treatment. There are staff on the school site, or if it is an event off site there will be a staff member with the children.

On Tuesday, schools were alerted to the following by West Midlands Police. This message is also on the home page of the school website.

West Midlands Police has been made aware of an App called "UNICO LIVE". The app is publicised as age restricted 12+ and designed for young people to upload videos of them performing, singing and dancing etc.; it has come to our attention that there is inappropriate content on the platform involving young people which is being investigated. The content does not appear to be monitored and we urge you to raise awareness widely to increase vigilance and reduce the likelihood of any child being sexually exploited.

Year 4 visit to Blakesley Hall
