

Welcome back!

Welcome back to the children, parents, carers and staff at the start of this new academic year. I hope that you had some sort of a break during the summer and are ready for the year ahead.

We will soon welcome our new Reception class who will be starting with us next week. They and their parents/carers have been meeting with Miss Gravell and Mrs Jones this week. It has been wonderful to have the children from the other six classes back in school. I ask that you keep last year's Year 6 children in your prayers as they start the next step of their lives in secondary education.

We continue with the start and end to the school day that was in place last school year. Children, accompanied by an adult, if that is the norm for your child, may come onto the school site from a few minutes before 8.50 a.m. and go into class via the playgrounds. The end to the day will continue to be 3.20 p.m. The large double gates may be used for entry and exit at the start and end of the school day. The gate by the Reception outdoor area is an exit only.

For the first times since March 2020, all of the children are having morning and afternoon break at the same time.

We are continuing with one longer P.E. lesson each week. To prevent clothing mix ups or uniform being handled by others or mislaid we are asking that on the day of their P.E. lesson the children wear an outdoor P.E. kit all day - they will therefore not need their uniform on that day. The outdoor P.E. kit is to be a P.E. t-shirt - not football shirts please - and shorts over which the children wear a long sleeved top and jogging/tracksuit bottoms or similar. For Year 1 to Year 6, the children may wear their Caritas Christi In Urbe Commonwealth Games t-shirts - if they still fit! Children are to wear trainers or pumps on their relevant day; for Year 1 this will be Tuesdays, for Year 2 it will be Mondays, for Year 3 it will be Wednesdays, for Year 4 it will be Fridays, for Year 5 it will be Thursdays and Year 6 will need to bring appropriate kit with them for Swimming on Fridays.

Peripatetic Music lessons resume from next week for most of our groups. The violin lessons with Mr Torma will now take place on Mondays, The drumming lessons which take place during the school day sessions with Mr Palmer will be on Tuesdays. The after school Percussion Ensemble will re-commence on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September. The flute and fife lessons with Mrs Lord will continue on Fridays. The cello lessons will take place on Thursdays from 29<sup>th</sup> September onwards.

# **Family Circumstances**

If parents/carers of any children are having hardship, particularly getting food, please contact the school and we will signpost you to groups that may be able to help you. We have been previously been able to source food parcels and other support for families where we aware of any need and will continue to do so. The school's Family Support Worker; Mrs Ranson, can also provide help and advice with any support required.


