### Rags2Riches4Schools

We have organised another collection from the Rags2Riches4Schools recycling scheme. We get 40p for every kilo we collect of clean and reusable items and would be most grateful if you could help us. All clothing is currently being sent to Ukraine.

Items that can be donated include: good quality clothes and accessories, adults, children's and babies clothing such as jackets, jumpers, hoodies, trousers, skirts, scarves, gloves, belts, handbags, paired shoes and other footwear etc.

They cannot reuse the following items: worn out shoes or clothes, clothes that are wet or have holes in, curtains, pillows or duvets, bric-a-brac or books, personalised items, work uniform, school uniform or school sports kit. Please use any bags you have at home and bring them to school on Tuesday 31st January. All bags are to be left in the gazebo in the school playground ready for collection from 9.00 a.m.

### Industrial Action by Teachers

Nationally, members of the NEU teaching union will be taking strike action next Wednesday  $1^{st}$  February. At our school this means that Year 1 and Year 3 will be closed to the children in those classes on that day.
